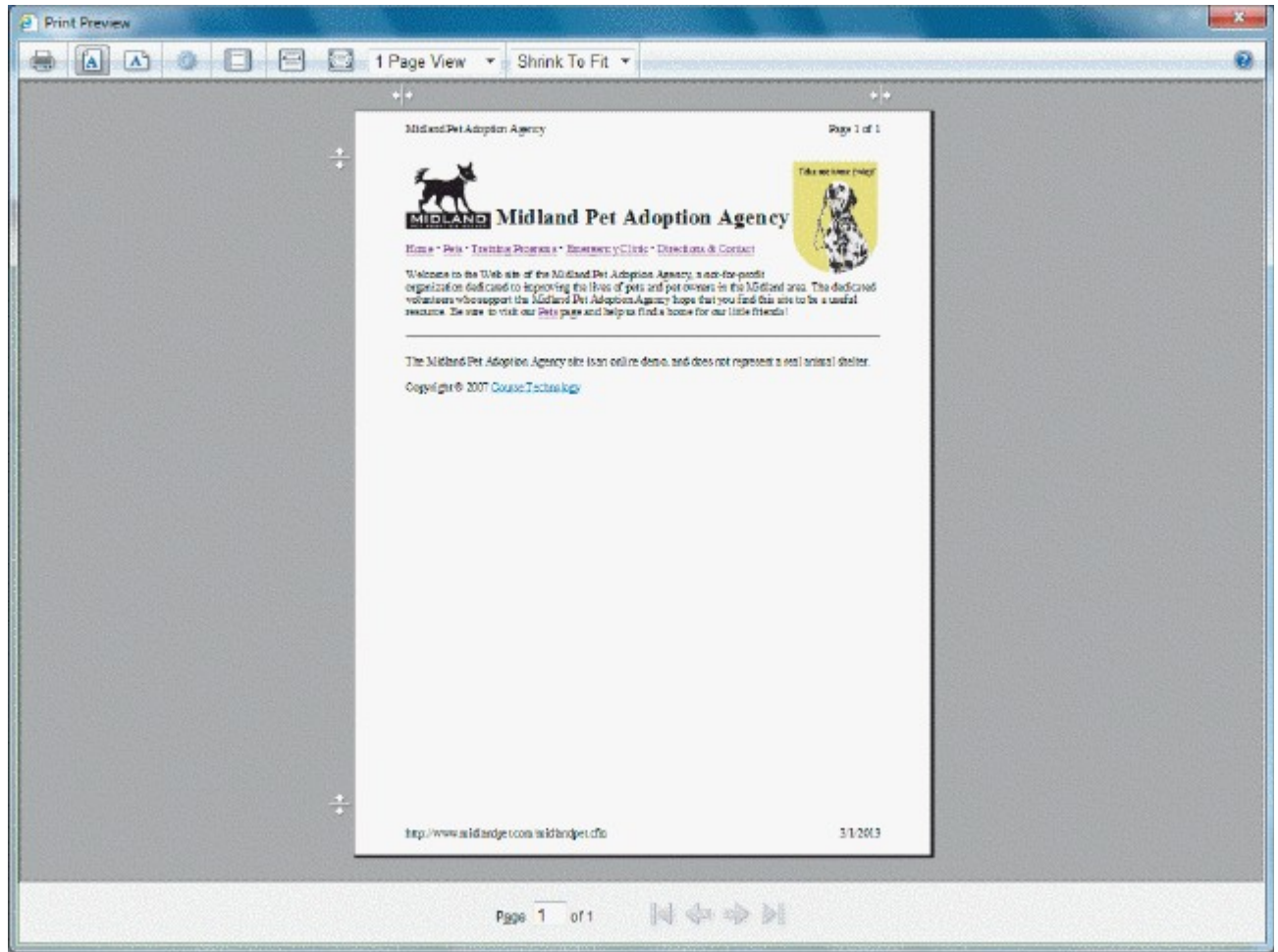

A domain name is a unique name associated with a specific IP address by a program that runs on an Internet host computer.

The pathname describes the hierarchical directory or folder structure on the computer that stores the file.

The filename is the name that the computer uses to identify the Web page's HTML document.

3. Define the word “copyright” and explain when it comes into existence. What is the “fair use” provision included in the U.S. copyright law?

ANS:

A copyright is the legal right of the author or other owner of an original work to control the reproduction, distribution, and sale of that work.

A copyright comes into existence as soon as the work is placed into a tangible form, such as a printed copy, an electronic file, or a Web page.

U.S. copyright law has a fair use provision that allows a limited amount of copyrighted information to be used for purposes such as news reporting, research, and scholarship. The source of the material used should always be cited.
