- 1) The crew person responsible for assisting a producer with such tasks as coordinating schedules, booking guests, or creating packages is the <u>associate producer</u>
- 2) The <u>director</u> is responsible for visualizing a script or event
- 3) General organization of the set and giving cues to talent is the job of the *floor manager*
- 4) The production assistant provides general, all-around assistance to a director or producer
- 5) The task of operating the production switcher and serving as crew chief is that of the *technical director*
- 6) Designing graphics and operating graphics generation equipment is done by the *graphic designer/operator*
- 7) The <u>camera operator</u> sets up and operates video cameras
- 8) The <u>audio mixer</u> is responsible for the technical and artistic quality of the program sound
- 9) Setting up, troubleshooting, adjusting, and maintaining all equipment used in a production are the tasks of the <u>engineer</u>
- 10) The <u>editor</u> selects, compiles, and cuts video and audio to produce programs
- 11) The personnel who work on a fixed salary and are thought of as having "artistic" roles in a production are referred to as <u>above-the-line</u>
- 12) The personnel who are paid a wage and are thought of as having "technical" roles in a production are referred to as **below-the-line**
- 13) Independent contractors who work for multiple production companies are known as **freelancers**
- 14) The set designer conceives, designs, and organizes the scenic treatment for a production
- 15) The tasks of positioning microphones, running audio cables, operating a sound boom, and troubleshooting audio problems are done by an <u>audio assistant</u>
- 16) A <u>camera assistant</u> helps the camera operator, works as a grip, pushes camera dollies, and handles cables

- 17) The role of <u>lighting director</u> involves designing, arranging, and controlling all lighting treatment in a production
- 18) In a dramatic production, a camera videographer may be called a *cinematographer*
- 19) The <u>assistant director</u> supports the director and will often take notes for a director and handle special shots and program timing
- 20) The person responsible for the overall organization of a production is the producer
